DRIVING

Judge: Mr Richard Lanni

The following classes are open to both BDS and non BDS members. The classes are affiliated to the BDS and BDS members will be eligible to gain points for the following competitions.

The Whitehall Cup is awarded for Open Private Driving Classes and the Chairman's Cup for Open Exercise Vehicle classes. The trophies and overall rosettes are awarded at the AGM of BDS Scotland. The points and reports are available on an ongoing basis on the BDS website.

- 1. Only fully paid up members of the BDS living in Scotland on the date of the show are eligible for Whitehall and Chairman's Cup points.*
- 2. The points for both trophies are available for singles and multiples at qualifying shows.*
- 3. Only Open classes which are open to all competitors will be qualifying classes for the trophies. (See below)*
- 4. If a class is amalgamated points will be awarded for one class. (See below)*
- 5. Points will be awarded to each turnout i.e. the same combination of driver/horse(s). (See below)*

6. Points will be awarded depending on the number of eligible competitors. The placing and points are irrespective of whether or not the competitors placed above or below are members of BDS Scotland. (See below)
7. All turnouts should be accompanied by a groom or helper. (See below)
8. Area Commissioners can nominate one unaffiliated show within their area to be a qualifying show. Only BDS affiliated shows or nominated shows can be qualifying shows.
9. Junior Drivers (under 18) must be accompanied in the vehicle at all times. (See below)
10. Any complaints about points or qualifying classes should be made to the BDS Scotland Secretary and not the show or the judge concerned.

Clarification:

Rule 3 The qualifying Private Driving Class/Exercise Vehicle class must be open to all competitors. If the show runs separate classes for specific native breeds, multiples or other specialist classes, their Open qualifying classes (Private Driving/Exercise Vehicles) cannot exclude any of these 'specialist' turnouts. Shows that exclude any competitors cannot be used as qualifiers for these trophies.

Rule 4 Classes could be amalgamated if there are insufficient entries e.g. Open Private Driving and Open Exercise Vehicle classes combined in this case points will be awarded as one class.

Rule 5 If a competitor changes horse(s) during the season or the turnout has a change of driver, the new combination will be treated as a new turnout. This rule does not include a change of vehicle/harness mid season.

Rule 6 The points in qualifying classes will be awarded depending on the number of eligible competitors if three eligible competitors are forward first place will be awarded 3 points second 2 points and third place 1 point. If the class has non-eligible competitors points will be awarded for the number of eligible competitors i.e. if there are five competitors in a class with two non-eligible competitors points will only be awarded to the three eligible competitors as above.

Rule 7 Each turnout must have a competent groom or helper in attendance. They do not necessarily have to be in the carriage during the class unless the judge requests this. Competent means being able to manage the turnout if need be.

Rule 9 All Junior Drivers must be accompanied by a competent person who is 18 years of age or over. A competent person means that they could drive the turnout if necessary and could take full responsibility in the event of an incident.

Class 43 Open Private Driving Class Pony/Horse (any breed/4 years old and over) – This class is affiliated to the BDS and BDS competitors are eligible to collect points for the Whitehall Cup Competition. The Whitehall Cup competition takes place throughout the season, with drivers collecting points according to their placings in Private Driving classes at BDS affiliated shows.

Class 44 Open Exercise Vehicle Driving Class (any breed/4 years old and over) – This class is affiliated to the BDS and BDS competitors are eligible to collect points for the Chairman's Cup Competition. The Chairman's Cup competition takes place throughout the season, with drivers collecting points according to their placings in Exercise Vehicle Driving classes at BDS affiliated shows.

SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1 The committee reserves the right to cancel or amalgamate classes in the event of insufficient entries.
- 2 All Registered entries must be registered or eligible for registration in the Welsh Stud Book or appropriate breed society. Any entries not complete will be returned.
- 3 The Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry. Entries must include the correct fee to be accepted. Incorrect entry fee will be returned to sender.
- 4 No exhibitor may enter and compete with an animal under a judge who is known to have bred, sold, produced or received financial gain from that animal.
- 5 **Exhibitors are requested to note the timetable, animals must be forward in time. Where an animal is entered in more than one class, the Committee can take no responsibility if a clash occurs. 'Latecomers will ONLY be admitted to the ring at the discretion of the Judge and the Head Steward'.**
- 6 Stallions and colts 2 years and over must be licensed with the WPCS (or breed societies) for stud purposes. All stallions must be correctly bridled and may not be led by a junior who has not attained their 14th birthday by 1st January in the current year. Stallions may not be ridden by a Junior who has not attained their 12th birthday by 1st January in the current year for Welsh Sections A & B or their 14th birthday by 1st January in the current year for Welsh Sections C & D.
- 7 The Judge's decision is final.
- 8 The Show Committee or any of its assistants or stewards will in no way be responsible for any loss, injury or damage that may happen to exhibitors or their assistants or other members of the public, or to any animal or property or to any vehicle brought into the Showground or leaving the same
- 9 All animals must be sound. If in the opinion of the Judge, an animal is considered to be unsound, the exhibitor will be given the option of withdrawing the exhibit from the class or asking that the official veterinary surgeon examine the animal. If no veterinary surgeon is available, the Judge's decision is final. The only exception to this rule would be in the case of a brood mare, providing lameness is definitely not of a hereditary nature.
- 10 Any animal found to be suffering from a contagious or infectious disease is to be removed from the Showground immediately at the request of the Show Committee.
- 11 Objections **MUST** be made in writing within thirty minutes of the event concerned and lodged with the Show Secretary together with the sum of £25. Objections will be referred to the Complaints Committee which will return the £25 if the objection is upheld
- 12 Correctly secured British Standard Skull Caps/Riding hats to current safety standards must be worn by riders at all times.
- 13 The safety of all children showing animals in the child-handling classes is the full responsibility of their parent or guardian.
- 14 Trophies are perpetual and the winner of any trophy or cup is responsible for its safe return to the Show Secretary in time for the following year's show. All trophies are the property of the Show.
- 15 The Committee reserves the right to substitute the judge at short notice if conditions warrant.
- 16 Foul language or abusive behaviour towards people or animals will not be tolerated, and will result in expulsion from the showground.
- 17 Any exhibitor who, in the opinion of the Committee, is in breach of the Show Rules may forfeit any awards or prizes gained and/or may be excluded from exhibiting at any future SWPCA Shows. Association members are asked to note paragraph 3.4. of the Association's Constitution, which details the disciplinary procedure which will also be referred to in the event of an apparent breach of the Show's rules.
- 18 Acceptance of the foregoing provisions will be a condition of entry.
