The Horse and Country Racehorses (HCR) series is open to Thoroughbreds who have raced, trained or been bred to race. Racing injuries will be ignored providing the horse is sound. Riders must be 14 years plus, ridden horses must be 4 years plus and veterans are 12 years plus. Judges will not ride and you will not be asked to gallop in your individual show. To qualify for the Championships at the Grand Slam at Ingliston on 24th September 2016, the handler/rider and horse must be registered with HCR, you must carry your cards in the ring for signing and be placed 1st – 4th (qualifications may be placed down to 6th place). Non members must send their qualification cards (presented by the judge), fees and register with HCR no later than 14 days after this show and before the closing date for entries for the Grand Slam.

CLASS 190

The Tattersalls and RoR Thoroughbred Ridden Show Horse Class

Thoroughbred mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, any height. Riders must be 15 years or over. Horses should be ridden in a snaffle, Pelham or simple double bridle. Horses should be plaited. **The first three go forward to the championship at the Royal Highland Show in 2018.** All entries **MUST** be registered with Weatherbys in their General Stud Book and **MUST** also be registered with the RoR. The class is open to thoroughbreds that have **RACED**. There will be a prize for the highest placed veteran 15 years or over. The class will be run under the rules of RoR. CLASS 301 EXERCISE VEHICLE CLASS (Two or four wheel): Open to horses/ponies singles or pairs, An exercise vehicle is a carriage not of traditional type design and includes those with pneumatic tyres these must be those specifically designed for carriages (i.e. not car tyres). Lamps need not be carried. Judging will include horse and vehicle suitability, correct fitting of harness, general cleanliness and safety turnout. This class is a Chairman's Cup points qualifier.

SHOW RULES

1. All animals entered for the competition must be the bona fide property of the entrants, the entrants' business, the entrants' employers or the entrants' family and must have been in their possession since 1st June, 2017.
2. No animal will be allowed to compete in more than one Class, except in certain Horse Sections (please check with Secretary prior to entering) and Class 41a.
3. Farm Cart Harness need not be the property of the exhibitor, who need not be a member of the Association. Harness must be exhibited upon a horse.
4. Where prizes or donations are given for any special class or purpose, such prize or donation shall be awarded to that class or purpose to which it was given.
5. Qualified persons must be in attendance upon each lot of livestock the whole time of the Show, and all attendants must be amenable to the orders of the Directors and Stewards.
6. With the exception of the Stewards and other members of the Committee in the discharge of their duties, no person will be admitted inside the judging rings or to interfere with or come in contact with the Judges on any pretext whatsoever.
7. All stock must be placed in the showyard half an hour before judging commences at 8.30 am. The gates will be shut and the showyard cleared of all persons, except those in attendance upon stock, one person being allowed to each lot and at 9.00 am the showyard will be open to the public.
8. No animal or lot shall be allowed to leave the showfield before 3.00 pm unless with the written permission of the Secretary.
9. No booths, refreshment stalls, itinerant or strolling players or vendors of any commodity whatsoever, will be admitted to the showyard without a pass from the Secretary, and should any person be found infringing this order, they will be immediately ejected.
10. Should there be any Class for which a sufficient number of entries have not been made to give a fair competition, the Directors reserve the power to reduce the prize offered, or withdraw that Class from competition.
11. Protests (if any) must be lodged with the Secretary in writing before 2.00 pm on the day of the Show; otherwise such protest will not be entertained. The Directors reserve the power to themselves to settle all protests or disputes that may arise, from whose decision there is no appeal. All protests must be accompanied with a deposit of £10.00 and if not sustained, this sum will be forfeited at the discretion of the Directors

Each exhibitor or entrant shall be solely responsible for any loss, injury or damage that may be done to, or occasioned by or arising from any animal, article or property exhibited or brought to the showfield by him and he shall indemnify and hold harmless the Association from and against all actions, suits expenses and claims on account of, or in respect of any damage or injury which may be caused or occasioned. Exhibitors must take their own risks of the pens, buchts and stalls provided by the Association and will be held to have satisfied themselves as to the sufficiency thereof before their stock is installed.

NPS Scotland Rules

1. Ponies may only qualify once for each NPS Scotland Competition Final.
2. All Mountain & Moorland Ponies must be registered in the main body of their respective stud book. Part bred, X registered ponies, ponies in the appendices of their main stud book and Eriskays are not eligible.
3. Qualification in the M. & M In Hand Section may go to 3rd in the Championship.

All others may go to no lower than 4th place.
4. A Judge is not obliged to award an NPS Scotland Finals qualification if he/she feels that the pony is not of a sufficient standard
5. Closing Dates for Entries: Competitors qualifying at Shows held before Monday 5th June 2017 must send their qualifying cards and entries in by Thursday 29th June 2017. Shows after 5th June 2017 adhere to a closing date of 5th August 2017 and Late Entries will NOT be accepted.

6. For Novice classes

A pony is not eligible to compete if, before 1st January in the current year, it has done any of the following:

- i. Won an open NPS affiliated mixed M&M Ridden class
- ii. Won a Ridden class at an Olympia, Horse of the Year Show or RIHS qualifying round
- iii. Qualified for Horse of the Year Show or RIHS Ridden classes
- iv. Qualified for the M&M Novice or Intermediate Ridden final at the NPS Summer Championship show or the NPS Scotland/Kilmannan Novice Final at NPS Scotland Championship Finals (Blair) (N.B. Ponies can compete as novices in this competition for two consecutive years provided they do not submit an entry to the final in the first year).
- v. Qualified for the M&M Ridden Championship final at Olympia in previous years

vi. If a pony qualifies for Horse of the Year Show or RIHS in its second year it is immediately de-noviced and cannot compete in the Kilmannan Final at Blair.

Ponies must be shown in a snaffle bit.

7. Flash nosebands and drop nosebands are not permitted in flat ridden classes.

8. Entry for the Finals can only be made by sending the official card duly signed by the Judge at the time of qualifying with your entry form.

9. The OWNER must be or become a member of NPS Scotland before entering the Finals.

10. M&M Novice ridden, Open ridden, Lead rein and First ridden classes are for ponies FOUR years old and over, M&M WHP classes are for ponies FIVE years old and over.

11. All ridden ponies must be shown off the lead rein except in the specified Lead Rein Qualifier Class.

12. M&M Lead rein ponies mares or geldings 4 yrs and over not exceeding 122cms. Dartmoor Exmoor, Shetland, New Forest, Welsh A and Welsh B. Riders must be 3 yrs on the day of the show and not to have reached their 9th birthday by the 1st January in the current year.

13. M&M First ridden ponies, mares or geldings 4 yrs and over not exceeding 128cms. Dartmoor Exmoor, Shetland, New Forest, Welsh A and Welsh B. Rider Riders not to reached their 12th birthday by the 1st January in the current year.

14. Max. Height for HP is 153cm at maturity and max. height for RP is 148 cm at maturity – foal classes excluded.

15. The Final will take place at the Blair Castle International Horse Trials on Friday 25th August 2017.
